Car Parking

We very much understand the frustration experienced by families not being provided a car park. Car Parking in all educational settings is a very complex topic.

In the context of our setting it is more complex as we are a large site, surrounded by a large Primary School connected to a very large R-12 Private school. We have a staff team of over 30 members, rostered at different times of the day as well as staff facilitating community programs; students completing tertiary placements and Midwives running a midwifery service. On many occasions there are not enough parks and often staff need to park their cars on the road away from the Carpark. Our Long Day Care families (including Before and after Preschool Care) can utilise the car park 7.00 to 8.15am and later in the day from 3.30 to 6.00pm. Between now and the end of the term we will trial opening the gate at 3.00pm when several staff members have completed their rostered day. If you are interested in being a volunteer Marshall from 3.00 - 3.30pm to ensure the Car Park is only utilised by Children's Centre families - please let me know.

School Connections Children in the Preschool program have been visiting the Keithcot Farm Primary School Resource Centre; Gym; playground; oval etc and participating in the KFPS Assemblies on alternate Fridays.

Uni SA – two Occupational Therapy students have been on placement at KFCC. The main objective of this placement are for the students to develop knowledge of child development and group management skills. Working alongside OT students is a great opportunity for our Educators to develop new skills and expertise in this critically important discipline.

Health

If your child is showing signs of being unwell before coming to the Children's Centre, it is important to keep him/her home for the day, and ring the Centre of your child's absence. Advice has been received from the Department of Health

informing us that

"Children who are suffering from vomiting and / or diarrhoea should not attend the Children's Centre. Parents / guardians will be contacted and asked to collect their child within an hour to reduce the possibility of the illness spreading.

The child will not be able to return to the Centre until all vomiting and / or diarrhoea has ceased for a period of at least

48 hours from the last episode and the child is feeling well.

This also supports the implementation of our Nature Play Curriculum. We have a large covered outdoor area, but sometimes children get caught in the rain if there is a sudden downpour, leaving the rest of their clothes wet. A warm rain jacket that can be independently removed and hung to dry will reduce the problem of wet clothes in winter.
